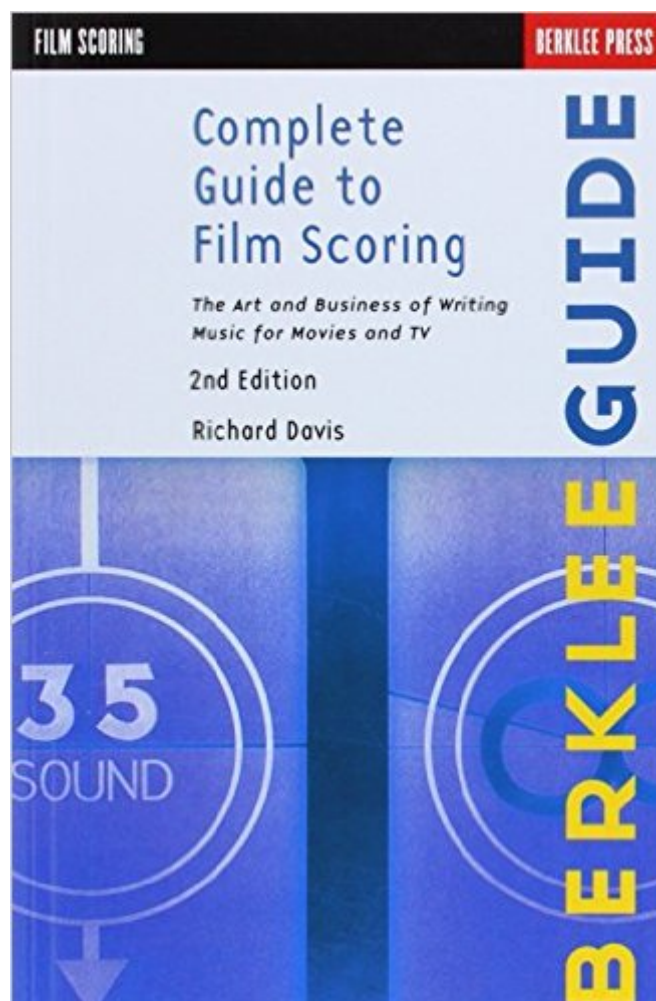

This book is not really about film scoring. It's about the business world of film scoring. If you are looking for a music book... this isn't it!The writing style is professional but uninspiring, as one would expect from a book about business. Well organized and to the point and if you are curious about the business side of film scoring you'll find this book not wholly out of date.

It's seemingly hard to find literature on the subject, so I don't have much to compare this book to. That said, I've learned SO much and I'm only about half way through. I was gonna skip to the parts that I thought would apply more to my current situation and I'm so glad I didn't. All of it is relevant, useful, and a good read. If film scoring is your thing, you should own this book.

It is surprisingly easy and pleasant to read. But it is NOT about teaching you MUSIC, like, how to orchestrate for a certain scene or a mood, but about PRODUCTION, the function of music within a movie, a little bit of history of cinema, business and stuff! Strongly recommend to all those who aspire to be part of the world of Film Scoring!

This book offers a well written brief history of film music, a broad explanation of the film music production process, and a thorough look at the industry in general. It gives the reader a clear and vivid insight into the fascinating world of the film composer. There are many useful business guidelines and some helpful tips about creativity. The thoughts and reflections of industry heavyweights are both inspiring and encouraging. The information about specific techniques and technology was rather thin, so this is not a technical manual explaining the finer details of the process of composing music for moving pictures.

to be honest it starts out pretty boring with history of film scoring, but later on it guides you through everything you need from pre-pro to post pro, ended with an excellent insight from people from the inside. then you realize how important the beginning chapters of the book about the history after you end the book.
