

This book is intended to help new users to learn the basic concepts of SolidWorks and good solid modeling techniques in an easy to follow guide that includes video instruction. It will be a great starting point for those new to SolidWorks or as a teaching aid in classroom training to become familiar with the software's interface, basic commands and strategies as the user completes a series of models while learning different ways to accomplish a particular task. At the end of this book, you will have a fairly good understanding of the SolidWorks interface and the most commonly used commands for part modeling, assembly and detailing after completing a series of components and their 2D drawings complete with Bill of Materials. The book focuses on the processes to complete the modeling of a part, instead of focusing on individual software commands or operations, which are generally simple enough to learn. The author strived hard to include the commands required in the Certified SolidWorks Associate test as listed on the SolidWorks website, as well as several more. SolidWorks is an easy to use CAD software that includes many time saving tools that will enable new and experienced users to complete design tasks faster than before. Most commands covered in this book have advanced options, which may not be covered in this book. I teach SolidWorks at the local college and have not been entirely impressed with this book. Many of the prints in the book are missing critical dimensions leaving the reader to either make a guess as to the dimension or open up the included part off of the CD and check it. Seems like the kind of thing that would be resolved easily by having 1 person try to make your parts before you printed out the book. My students also complain that he is unclear at certain places in the book, but they are usually complaining about something. I recommend the book by Paul Tran myself. And don't forget the excellent tutorials built-in to SolidWorks itself.

Some of the drawings for the parts are drafted extremely poorly. Takes some brain power to figure them out. Also, during some of the chapters, the author will digress into great detail about different features. Can be a bit confusing and, in my opinion, could be organized differently to be clearer and easier to follow through.

I have 3 years of experience using AutoCAD programs, and while I love solid works, this book isn't that great. I required this book since I'm now in college, so I purchased this book from our local book store. What I wasn't expecting was how many drawings in this book have incorrect dimensions. It leaves you to guess the correct length which may or may not be wrong. Sometimes we all look over at each others drawings and all of us have different shapes, none of which are close to the book. Overall I guess it is good for beginners, but be warned, there are mistakes in this book.

Very informative, highly recommended for anyone with little or no experience in solidworks.

Pretty thorough. I've taken courses with multiple CAD programs so I bought this to skim through as a refresher for SolidWorks. It had good step-by-step instructions.
